# What is the Primary PE and Sport Premium?

- The Sports Premium is an allocation of funds from the government to support children's physical development. The school receives funds based on the number of children on roll, together with a lump sum, and the Headteacher and Governing Body then decide how the money is used to support the children's education.
- All schools are required to report on the amount of funding received, how this is being used and the impact of the work undertaken.

# What is the purpose of the Primary PE and Sport Premium?

All children and young people should live healthy active lives. The UK Chief Medical Officers recommend that all children and young people should take part in moderate to vigorous intensity physical activity for at least 60 minutes every day. Schools have a key role to play in achieving this aim.

Schools should use the PE and sport premium funding to help achieve these aims, prioritising the following 5 areas:

- increasing all staff's confidence, knowledge and skills in teaching PE and sport,
- increasing engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity and sport,
- raising the profile of PE and sport across the school, to support whole school improvement,
- offering a broader and more equal experience of a range of sports and physical activities to all pupils,
- increasing participation in competitive sport.
