Understand that Hindus enjoy the celebration remembering how the community came out to guide Rama and Sita back to safety. Know that the community of Christians join to celebrate Christmas, Jesus is described as the light of the world and Christians in some churches count down to Christmas using an advent wreath. Topic: Grow Your Own Understanding Christianity: Gospel Christians use Jesus' example of friendship and emulate this in their own lives.
